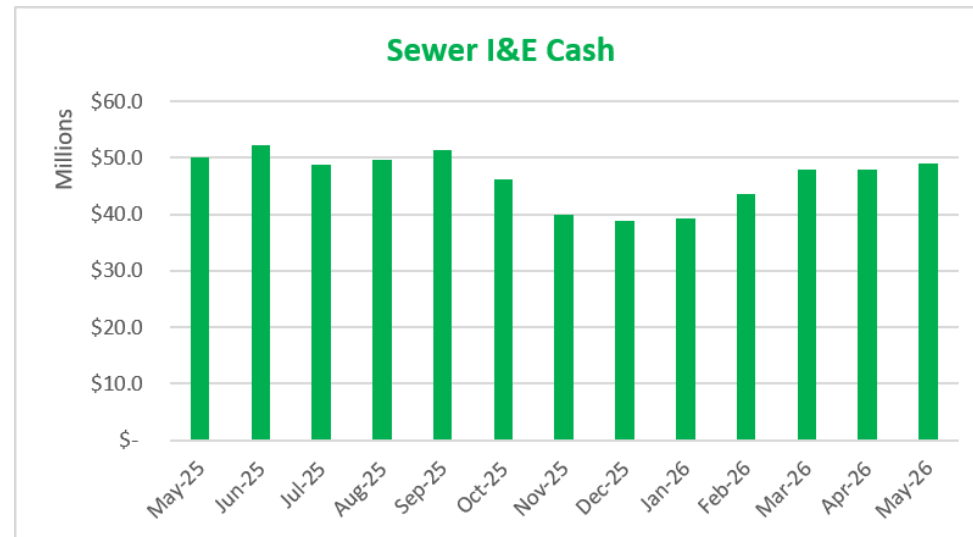
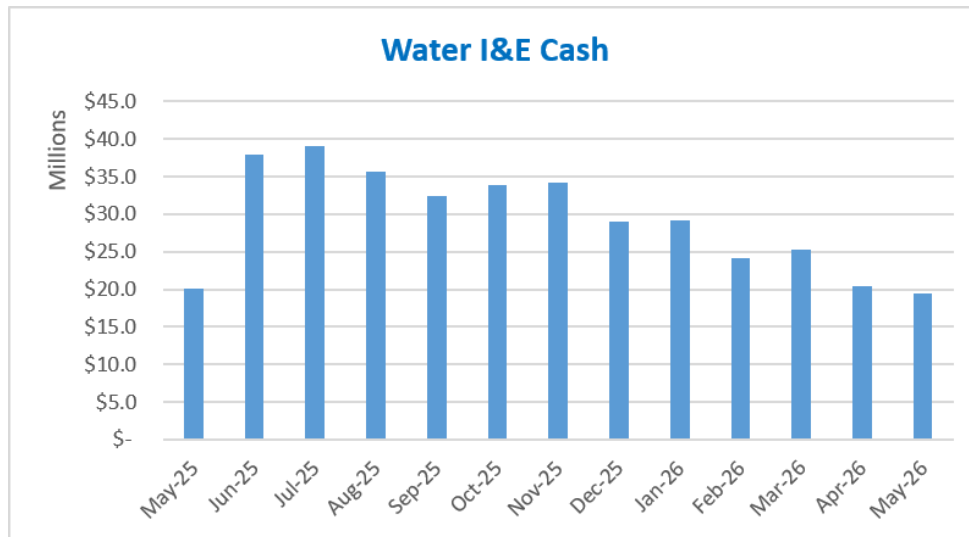
May 2026 Highlights – Operating Cash

- DWSD continues to maintain adequate cash reserves to support its operating and capital programs.
- On a systemwide basis, Cash and Investments in the Operating, Improvement & Extension (I&E), Trust accounts and Construction accounts amounted to \$237.0 million (\$77.1 million in the Water Fund and \$159.9 million in the Sewer Fund). This represents an overall decrease of \$1.4 million over the April balance.
- Water Operating Cash** of \$7.6 million decreased by \$140,000 over the previous month.
- Sewer Operating Cash** of \$33.8 million increased by \$2.0 million over the previous month.



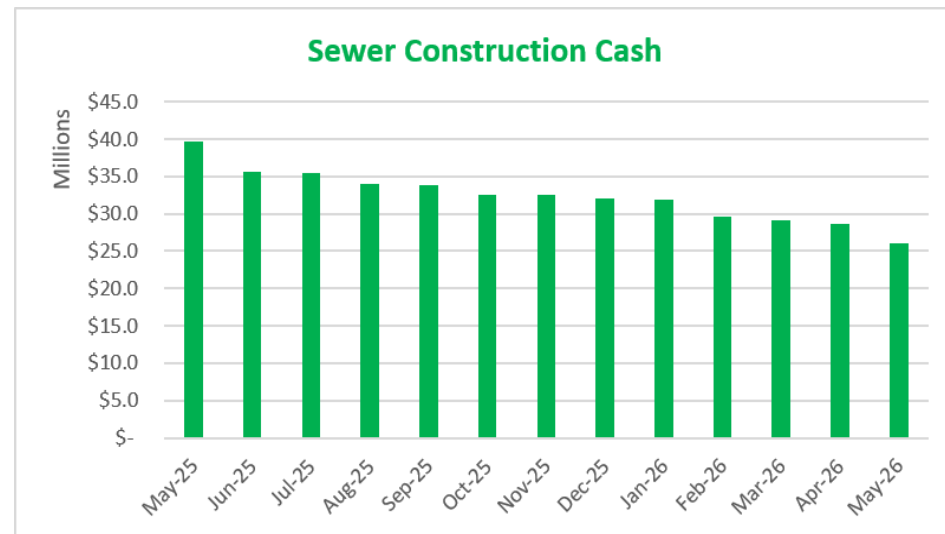
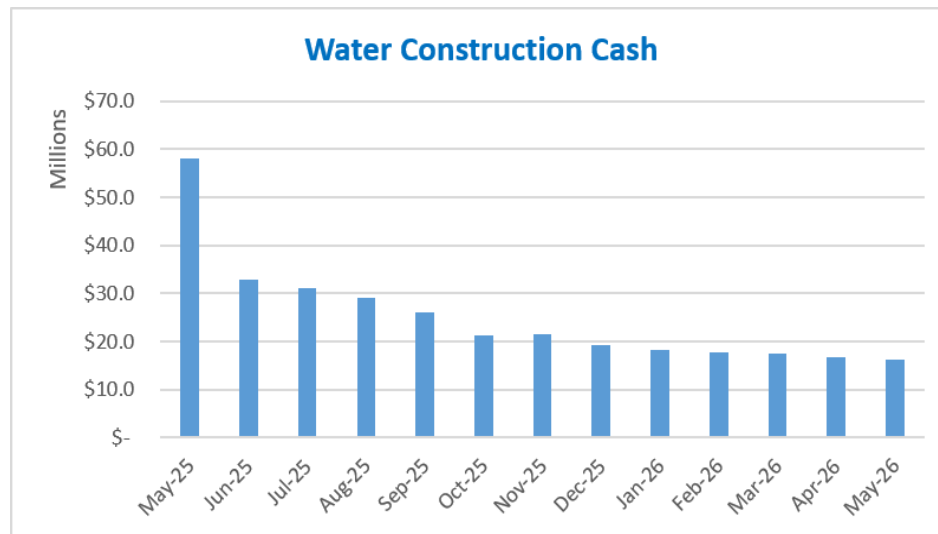
May 2026 Highlights – Improvement & Extension (I&E) Cash

- DWSD continues to spend down I&E and Construction Cash in support of its Capital Improvement Program.
- Water I&E Cash** amounted to \$19.5 million at the end of May, a decrease of \$946,000 over April balance.
- Sewer I&E Cash** amounted to \$49.1 million at the end of May, an increase of \$1.1 million over April balance.



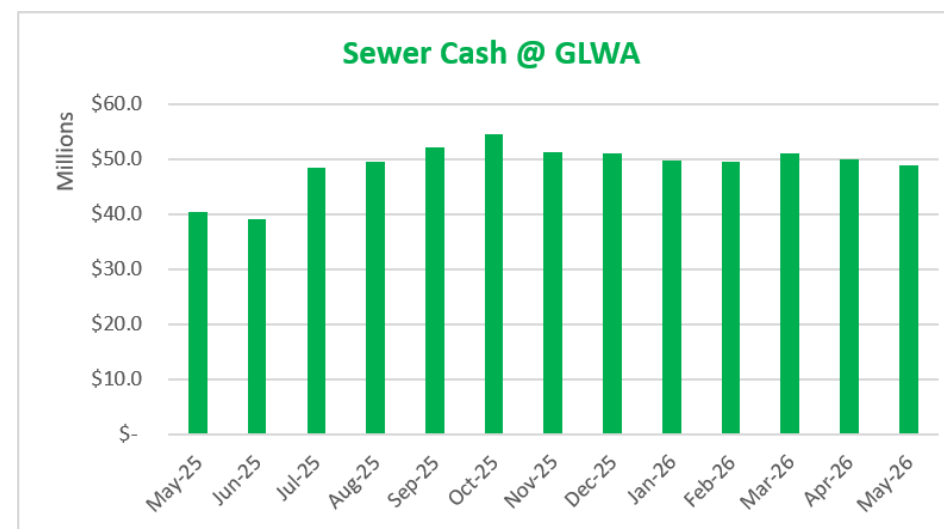
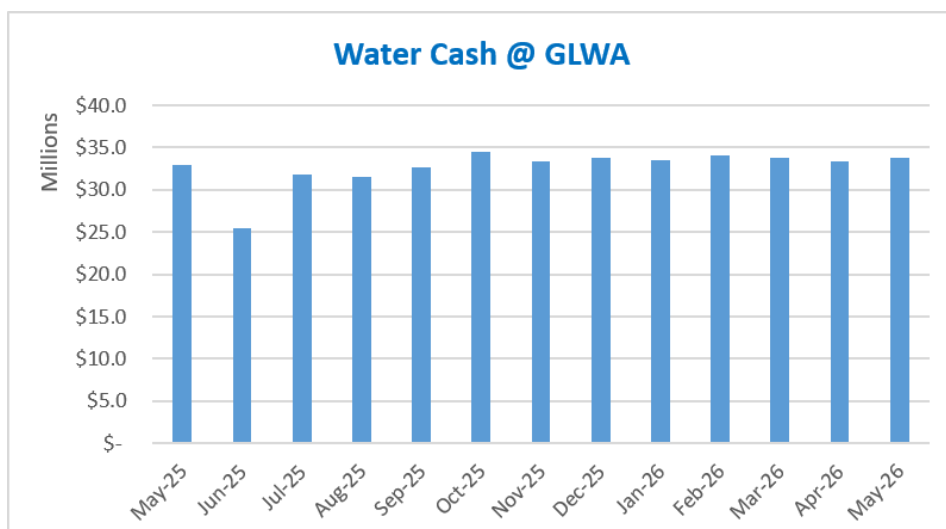
May 2026 Highlights – Construction Cash

- **Water Construction Cash** amounted to \$16.3 million at the end of May, a decrease of \$281,000 over April balance.
- **Sewer Construction cash** amounted to \$26.0 million at the end of May, a decrease of \$2.6 million over April balance.



May 2026 Highlights – Cash Held in Trust

- **Water Cash @ GLWA** amounted to \$33.8 million at the end of May, an increase of \$368,000 over April balance.
- Retail Water receipts of \$11.0 million in May exceeded the target collection by \$368,000 for the month.
- **Sewer Cash @ GLWA** amounted to \$49.0 million at the end of May, a decrease of \$904,000 over April balance.
- Retail Sewer receipts of \$25.1 million in May fell short of the target collection by \$904,000 for the month.



May 2026 Highlights - Comparative Accounts Receivable

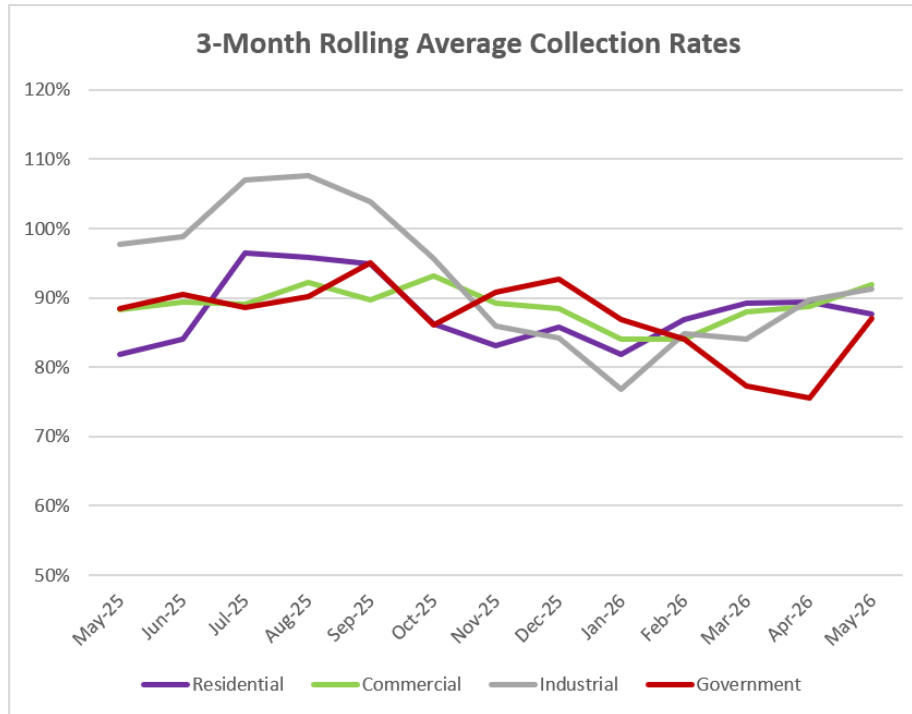


- May sales were \$41.1 million, a \$711,000 (1.8%) increase from April's \$40.4 million.
- Receivables of \$349.2 million for total active accounts increased by \$2.3 million (0.7%) compared to April receivables of \$346.9 million.
- May's cash collection \$36.6 million increased by \$1.4 million (3.7%) compared to April's cash collection of \$35.2 million.
- Active Residential Accounts Receivable increased by \$760,000 (0.3%) and the aging days remained steady to April.
- Allowance for Doubtful Accounts are 84.3% of the Total Accounts Receivable (including Tax Roll Transfer) balance as of May.

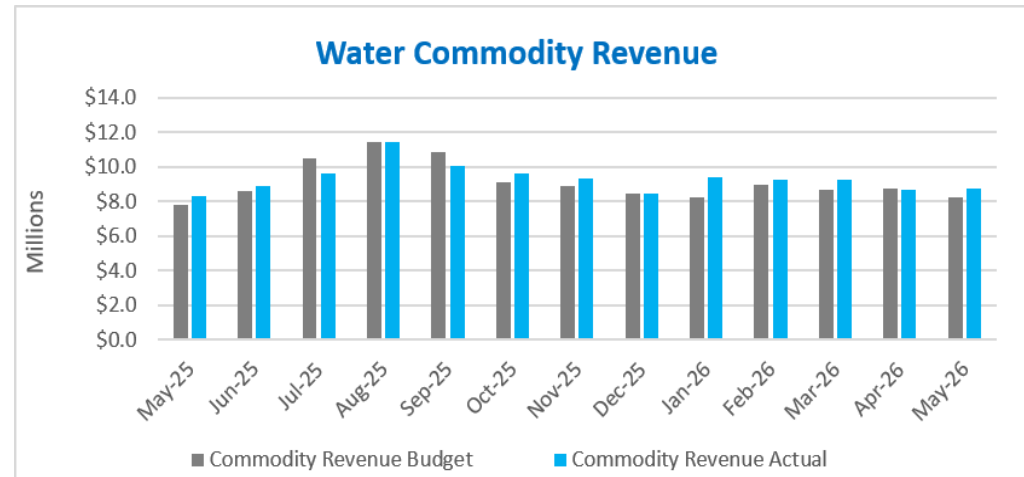
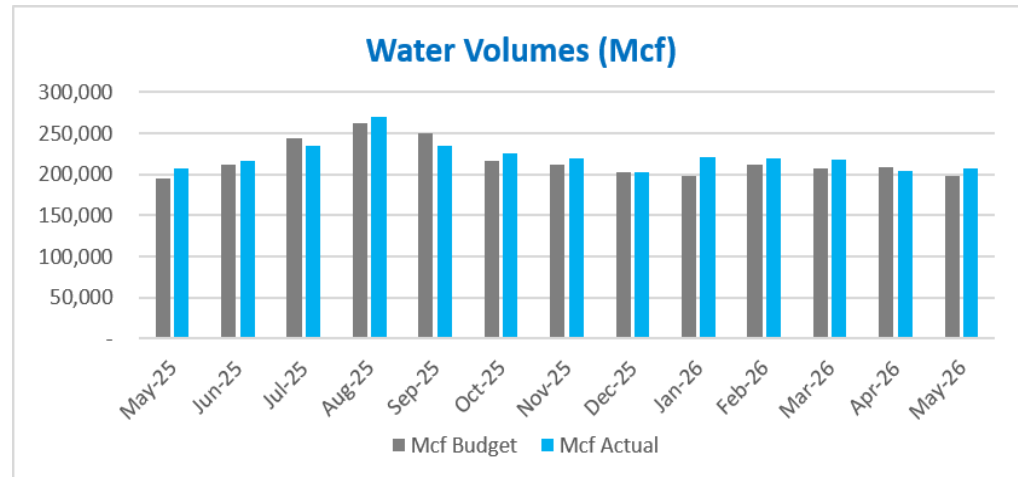
- May combined collection rate was 90.7% for all active customer compared to 85.6% in April. The 3-month moving average rate for all active customer classes was 89.6% compared to 88.5% in April.

- Residential** collection rate for the last three months have averaged at 87.7%, a decrease from the 3-month average of 89.3% in April. May collections stood at 85.7% compared to 80.8% in April.
- Commercial and Industrial** - Commercial 3-month rolling rate averaged at 91.9%, an increase from the 3-month average of 88.8% in April. May collection stood at 91.9% compared to 88.8% in April. Industrial 3-month rolling rate averaged at 91.3%, an increase from the 3-month average of 89.7% in April. May collection stood at 91.3% compared to 89.7% in April.
- Tax Exempt** collection rate for the last three months have averaged 92.1%, a decrease from the 3-month average of 94.4% in April. May collection stood at 84.0% compared to 95.1% in April.
- Government** collection rates for the last three months have averaged at 87.0%, an increase from the 3-month average of 75.6% in April. May collections stood at 112.0% compared to 73.0% in April.

May 2026 Highlights - Water Commodity Metrics and Revenues

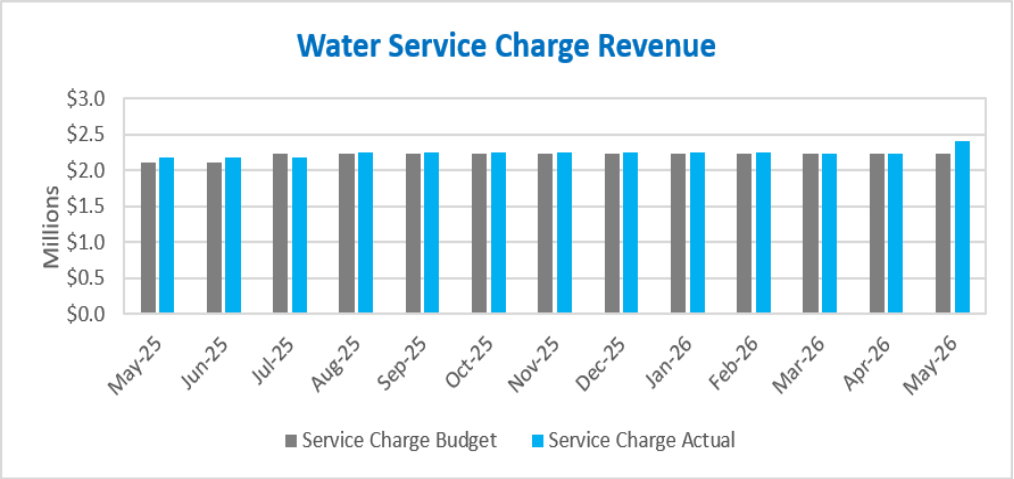
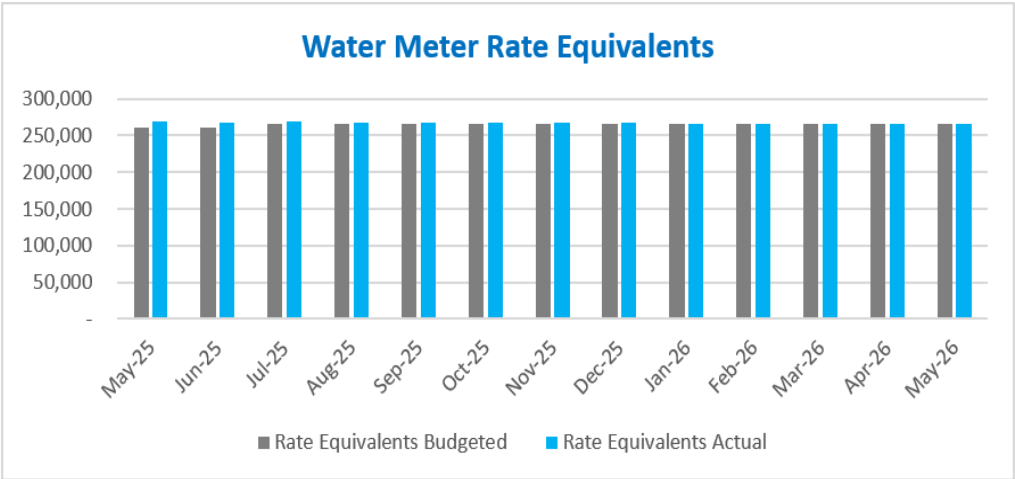


- May actual Volume exceeded the budget for the month by 4.6% and was 1.3% higher than actual April Volume and 0.2% above May 2025 Volume.
- Year-to-date actual Water Volume was 1.9% above seasonally adjusted budget.
- May actual Commodity Revenue exceeded the budget for the month by 6.1% and was 0.5% higher than actual April Revenue and 5.5% above May 2025 Revenue.
- Year-to-date actual Commodity Revenue was 1.7% above seasonally adjusted budget.



May 2026 Highlights - Water Service Charge Metrics and Revenues

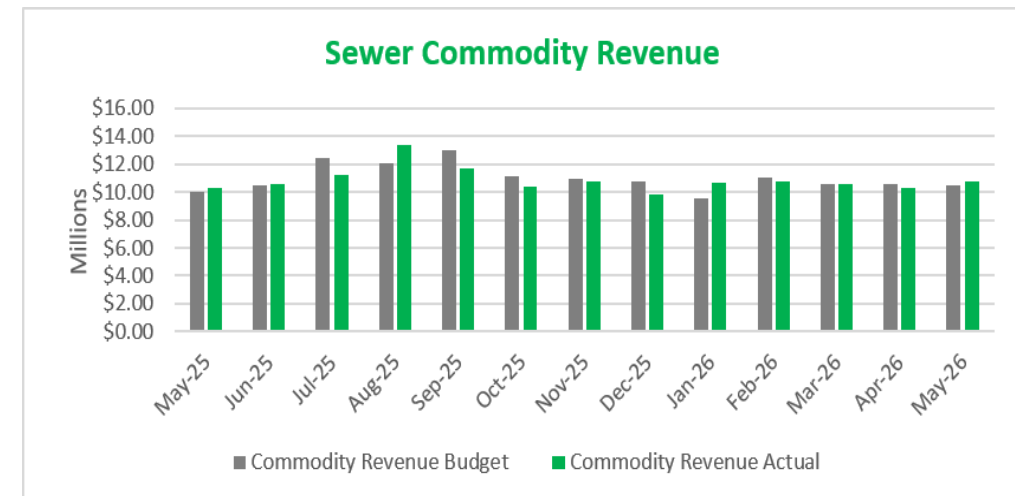
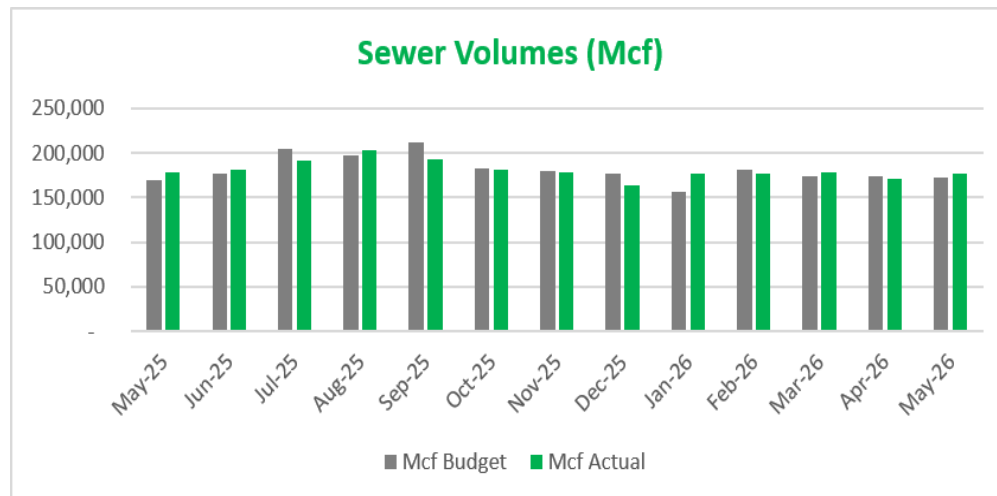
- May actual Meter Equivalents fell short of the budget for the month by 0.2% and was 0.4% below April Equivalents and was 1.1% below May 2025 Equivalents.
- Year-to-date actual Water Meter Equivalents exceeded budget by 0.3%.
- May actual Water Service Charge Revenue exceeded the budget for the month by 8.1% and was 7.6% above actual April Revenue and was 10.4% above May 2025 Revenue.
- Year-to-date actual Water Service Charge Revenue exceeded the budget by 1.2%.



May 2026 Highlights - Sewer Commodity Metrics and Revenues



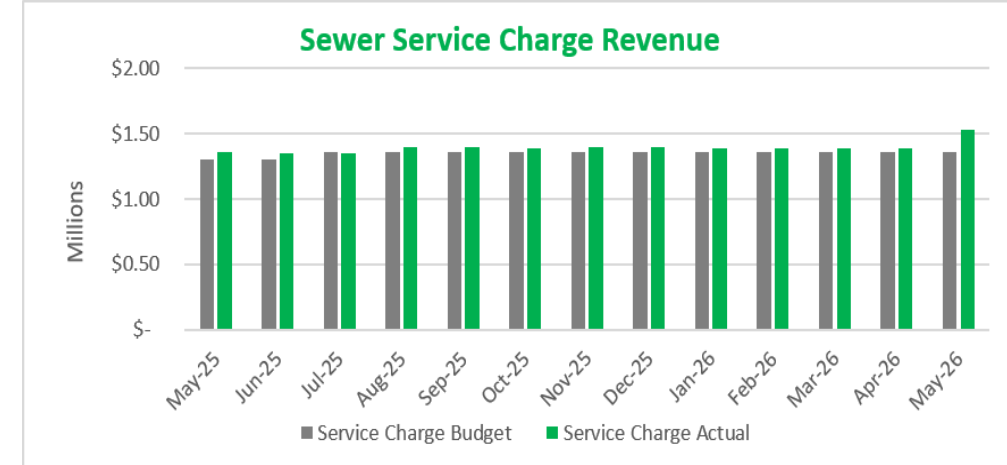
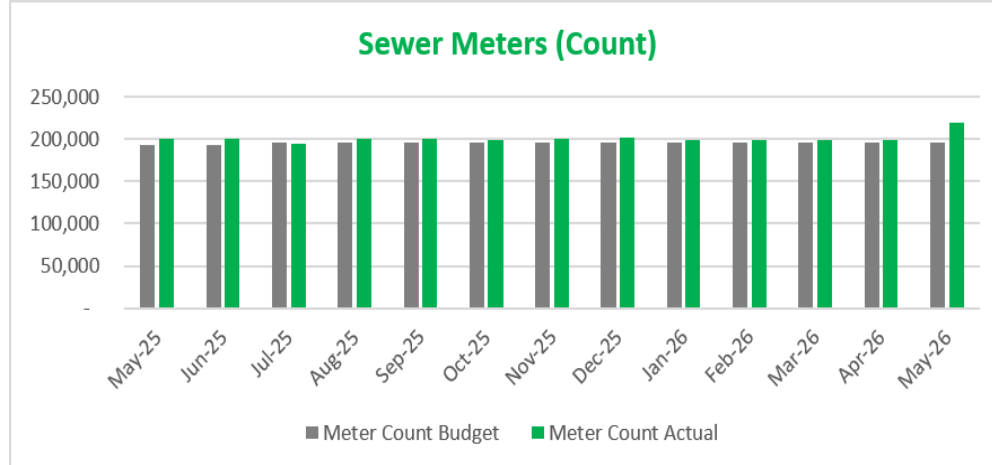
- May actual Volume exceeded the budget for the month by 2.9% and was 3.2% higher than actual April Volume but was 0.8% lower than May 2025 Volume.
- Year-to-date actual Sewer Volume was 0.8% below seasonally adjusted budget.
- May actual Commodity Revenue exceeded the budget for the month by 2.6% and was 4.3% higher than actual April Revenue and was 4.6% higher than May 2025 Revenue.
- Year-to-date actual Commodity Revenue was 1.8% below seasonally adjusted budget.



May 2026 Highlights - Sewer Service Charge Metrics and Revenues



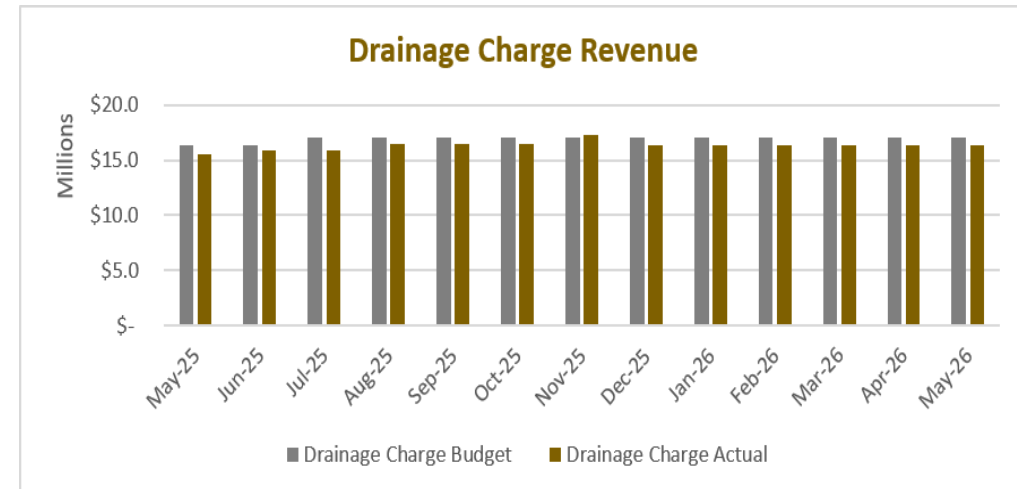
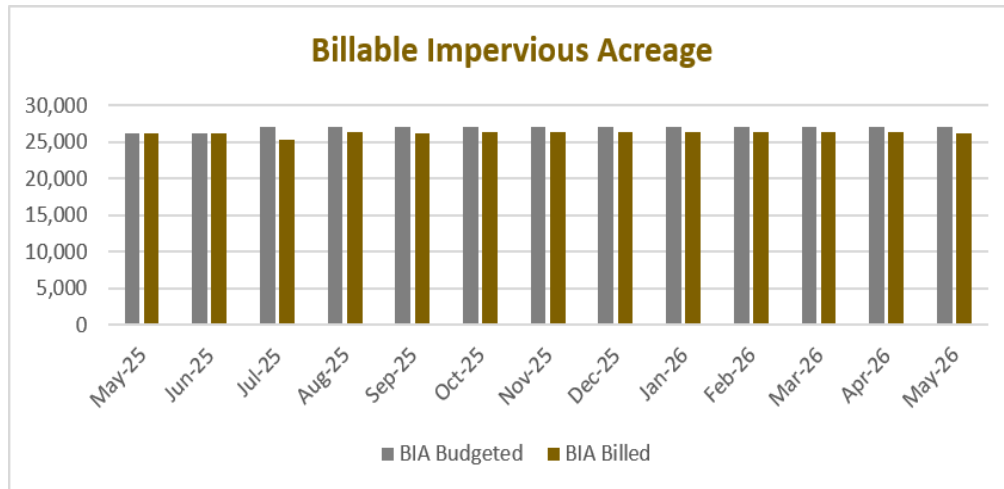
- May actual Sewer Meter Counts exceeded the budget for the month by 12.2% and were 10.5% higher than actual April Counts and were 9.2% above May 2025 Counts.
- Year-to-date actual Sewer Meter Counts exceeded budget by 2.8%.
- May actual Sewer Service Charge Revenue exceeded the budget for the month by 12.2% and was 10.5% above actual April Revenue and was 12.8% over May 2025 Revenue.
- Year-to-date actual Sewer Service Charge Revenue exceeded budget by 2.7%.



May 2026 Highlights - Drainage Charge Metrics and Revenues



- May actual Billable Impervious Acreage (BIA) fell short of the budget for the month by 2.8% but was steady with April actual BIA and was 0.3% above May 2025 actual BIA.
- Year-to-date actual BIA was 3.1% below budget.
- May actual Drainage Revenue fell short of the budget for the month by 4.3% but was steady with actual April Revenue and was 5.7% above May 2025 actual Revenue.
- Year-to-date actual Drainage Charge Revenue was 3.9% below budget.
