AFFORDABILITY BILLS



- SB 549/HB 5088 Affordability Program
- SB 550/HB 5089 Affordability Funding
- SB 551/HB 5090 Shutoff Protection
- SB553/HB Decriminalization of Residential Water Turn-Ons
- SB 554/HB 5091 Right to Have Service in Tenant's Name

- First 3 bills are tie-barred
- All bills introduced in Senate and referred to Committee on October 3, 2023; formal hearing on October 31
- All bills introduced in House and referred to Committee on October 4; formal hearing on October 26
- Meeting with legislators; working on friendly amendments
- Anticipate vote out of committee after recess



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- Not enough protection
- Should not be tie-barred
- Want guaranteed 2-3% cap on bills
- Too liberal and a handout
- Unlimited subsidy
- \$2 per meter fee (too high/too low)
- Burden on water provider billing systems
- Takes away important disincentive to tampering with assets; stealing water
- Landlords concerned about rent reduction mandate



• HB 4675

The properties of a land bank authority are exempt from all ... user fees imposed by a local unit of government

- Introduced May 25, 2023 by legislators in Kent and Oakland County; referred to Local Gov't committee
- Exempts Land Banks from stormwater management charges
- Introduced with retroactivity to 2004
- Referred to Tax Committee October 4, 2023
- Reported out of Tax Committee November 1, 2023; removed retroactivity in Substitute Bill



• SB 660

- Regulates creation of stormwater management utilities by local units of government
- Allows collection of fees
- Must offer ways to reduce or eliminate fee
- Appeal process
- NOT a mandate to create a stormwater management utility
- NOT retroactive; does not affect existing stormwater management utilities by local government

- Introduced and referred to committee on November 9, 2023
- DWSD monitoring, but bill does not directly affect City's drainage charge
