- \$1.0B Funded via SRF/America Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)
- \$500 Million funded via Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act
- City of Detroit is well positioned to receive significant grants
- Detroit typically qualifies as a Significantly Overburdened Community **Why SRF Program?**
- The State of Michigan is using the SRF Program
- SRF requirements will apply to all projects which includes:
 - Development of a Project Plan and NEPA Compliance on Federal Crosscutting Rules
 - Strict Adherence to fixed project milestones as negotiated by EGLE and DWSD
 - Compliance with Buy America, Davis Bacon Wages, DBE Participation Requirements


Project Area

Up to \$20M investment for rehabilitation of existing DWSD combined sewer assets in the neighborhoods of:

- Hubbard Farms
- North Corktown

Project Highlights



- Project includes sewer main replacement, sewer lining, manhole repairs
- DWSD Risk Assessment modeling techniques were used to identify project area
- Condition Assessment data gathered in 2023-2025 was used to develop and guide rehabilitation strategies and confirm repair locations
- Sewer segments, manholes, and catch basins included in the project plan
- In the event that 100% grant funding is not secured, DWSD is under no obligation to move forward with construction
