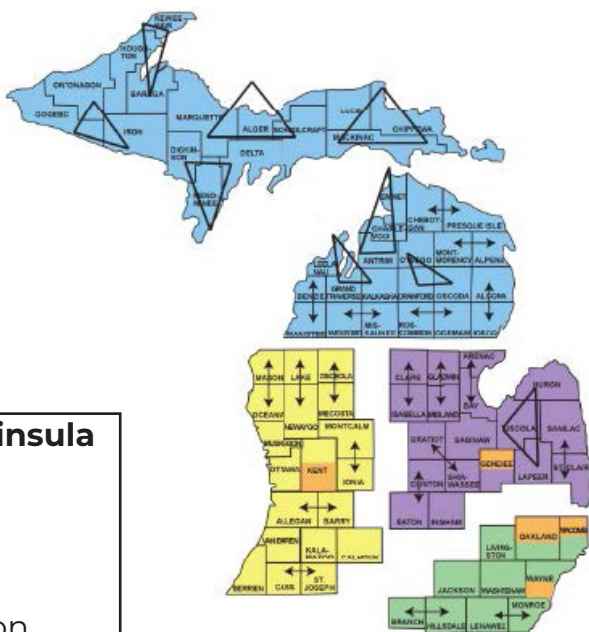


SENIORS:

Safe, Affordable and Reliable Drinking Water is Possible Under Proposed Michigan Water Affordability Legislation

- Legislation proposed in Lansing would **create a water affordability fund** to help low-income eligible customers who are struggling to pay their water bill.
- The legislation also **provides safeguards to protect customers from sudden shut-offs** of water service.
- Eligibility is based on household income.
- **Seniors pay a capped amount** that includes a \$2 monthly fee on every water bill that goes to the fund. **This is not an extra charge** and is similar to the monthly fee on gas and electric bills.
- More than 25% **seniors across Michigan** need this proposed program – **about 500,000 seniors statewide** – would be eligible.
