SENIORS:

Safe, Affordable and Reliable Drinking Water is Possible Under Proposed Michigan Water Affordability Legislation

- Legislation proposed in Lansing would create a water affordability fund to help low-income eligible customers who are struggling to pay their water bill.
- The legislation also provides safeguards to protect customers from sudden shut-offs of water service.
- Eligibility is based on household income.
- Seniors pay a capped amount that includes a \$2 monthly fee on every water bill that goes
 to the fund. This is not an extra charge and is similar to the monthly fee on gas and electric
 bills.
- More than 25% seniors across Michigan need this proposed program about 500,000 seniors statewide would be eligible.




